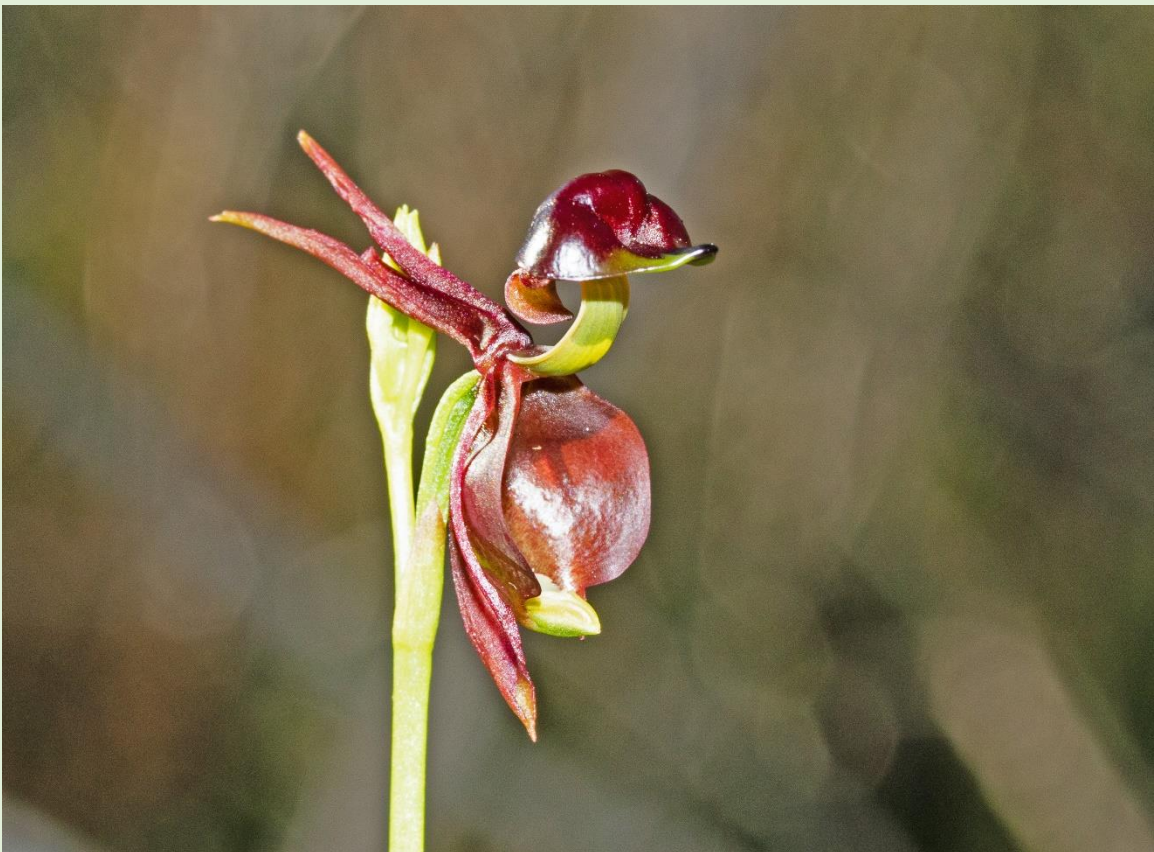

Xanthosa pilosa





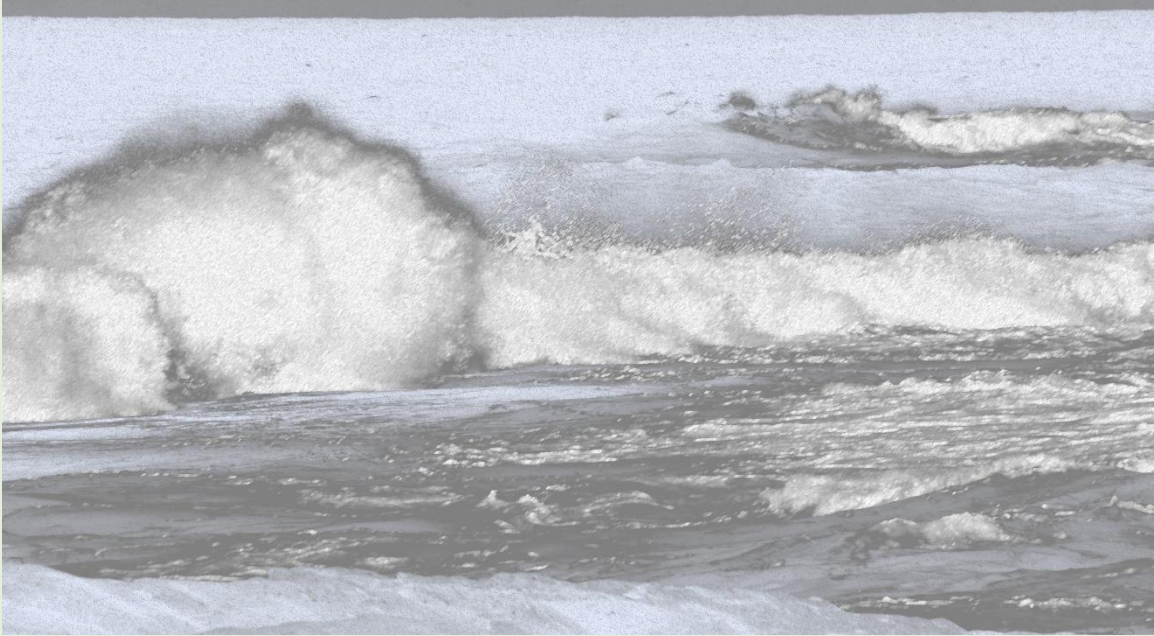

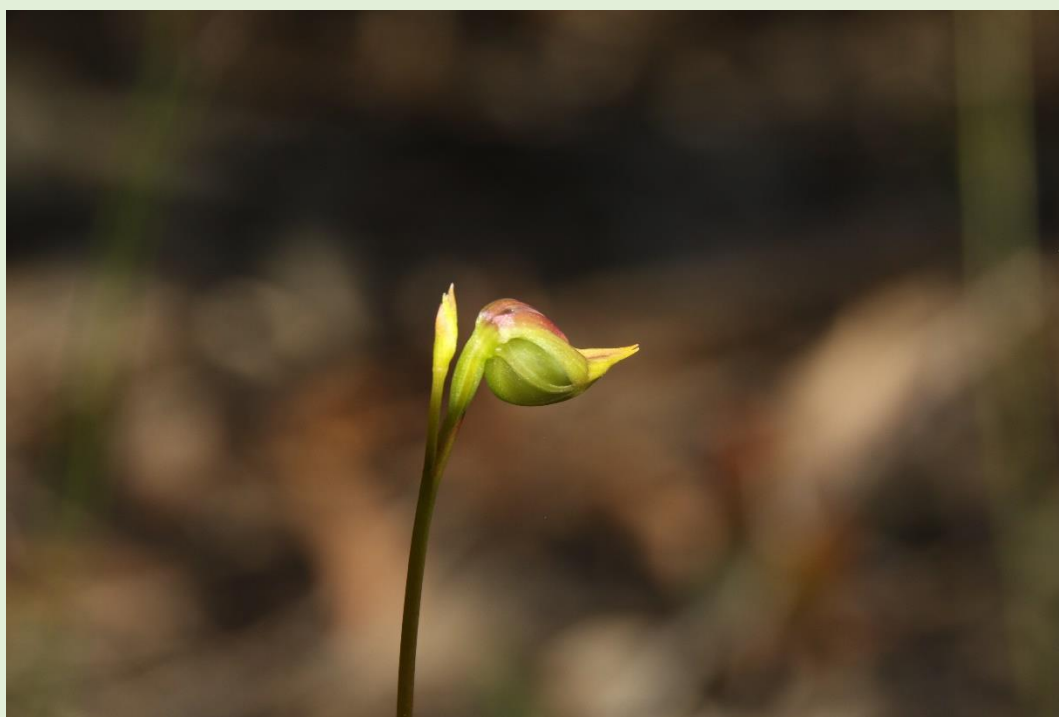
