So, come along. I promise you very little in the way of words but lots of pictures Without captions. Just enjoy the images!

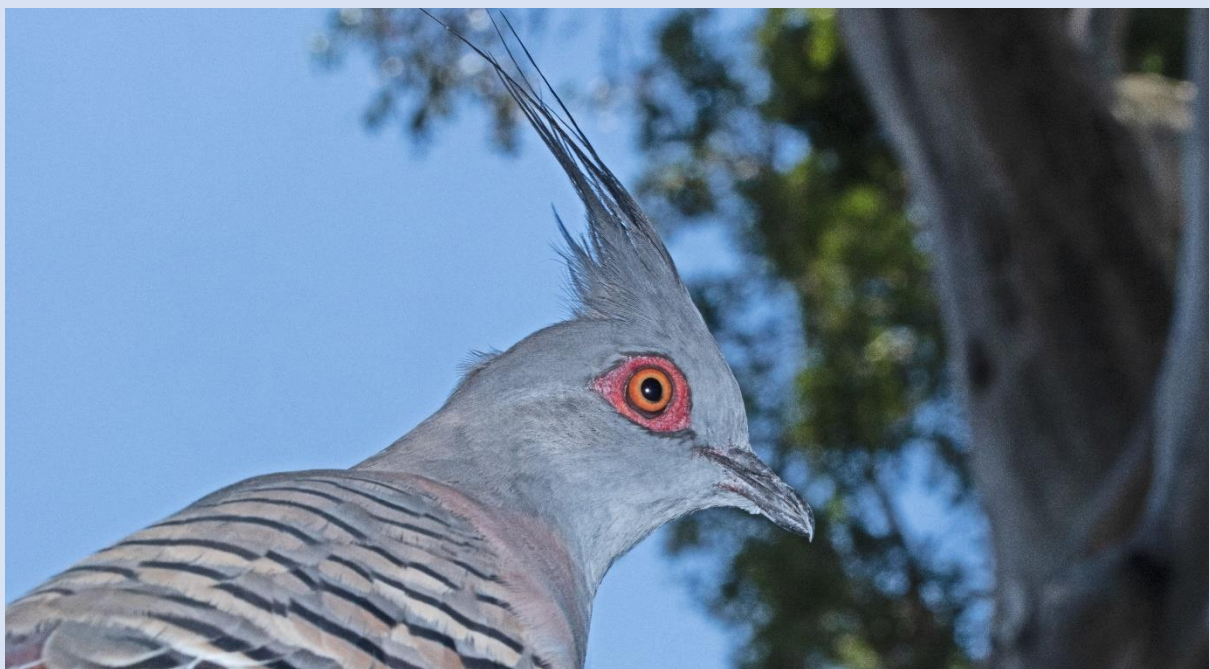

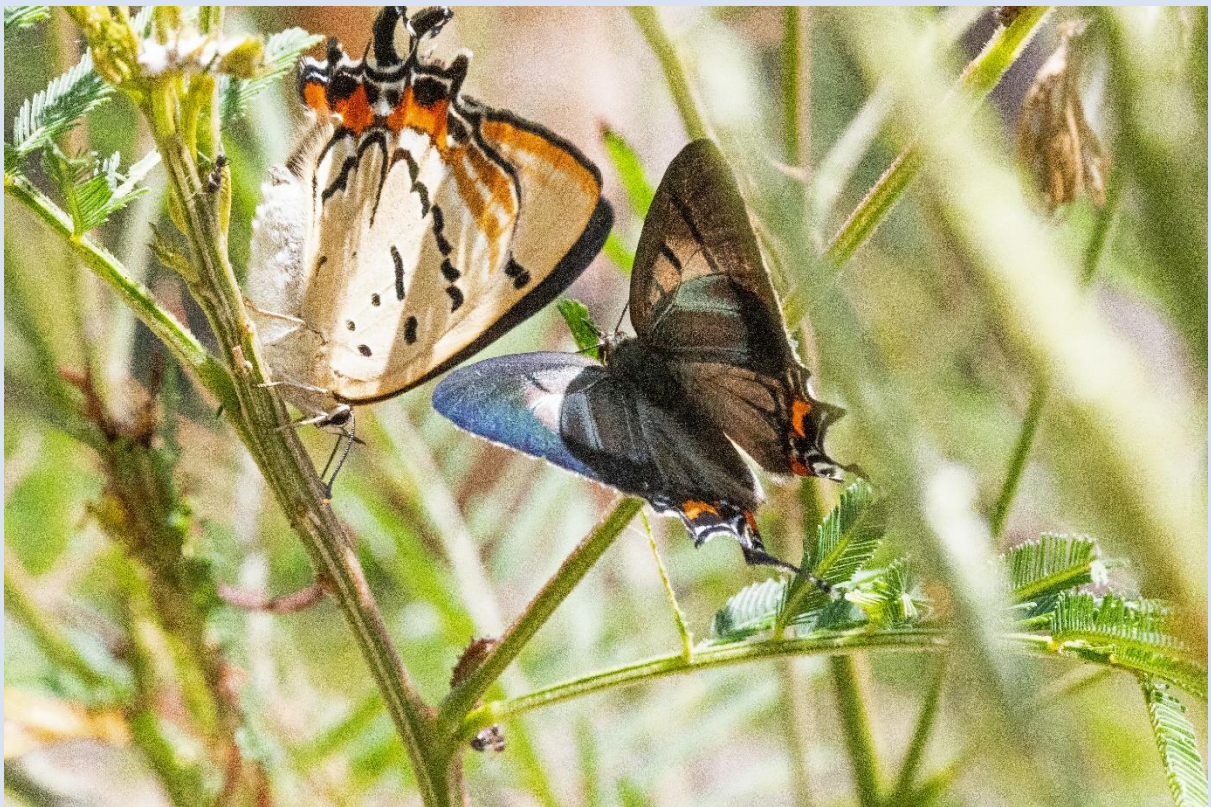
January

- The odd football games







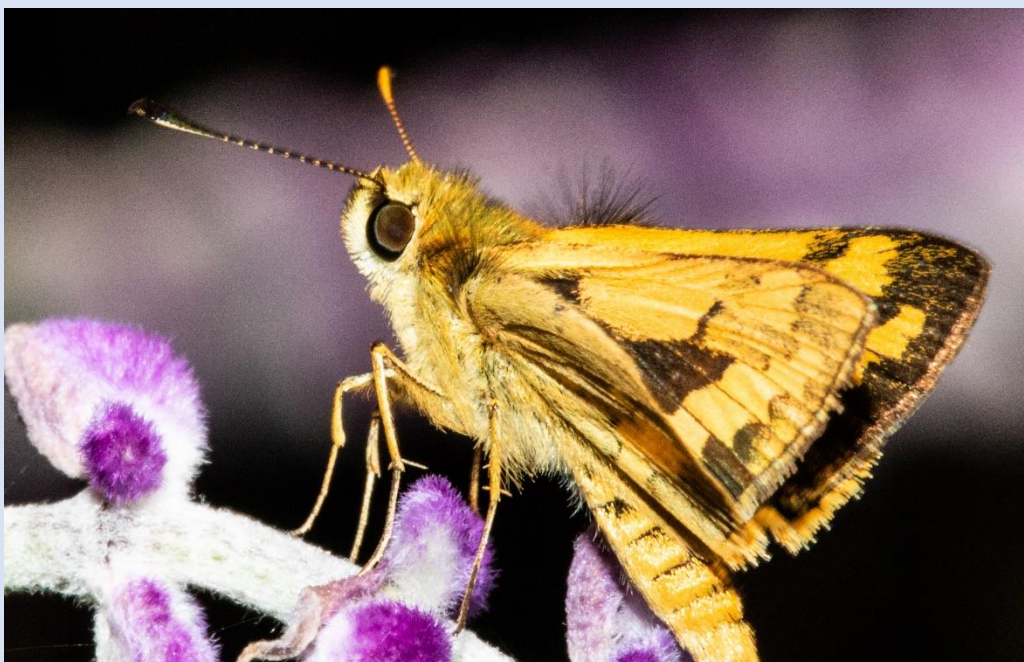


February

- Quick trip to Taree







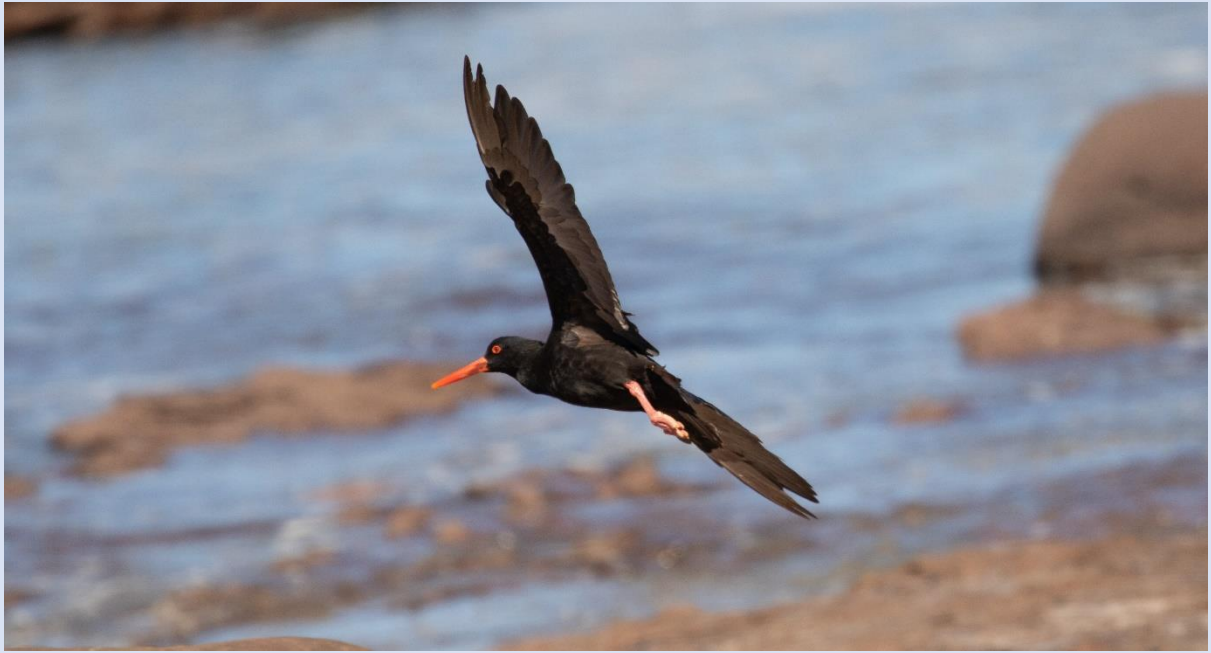


March

- The walks are getting shorter and more difficult: Since late 2021, suffering from a hernia that continues to bulge dangerously





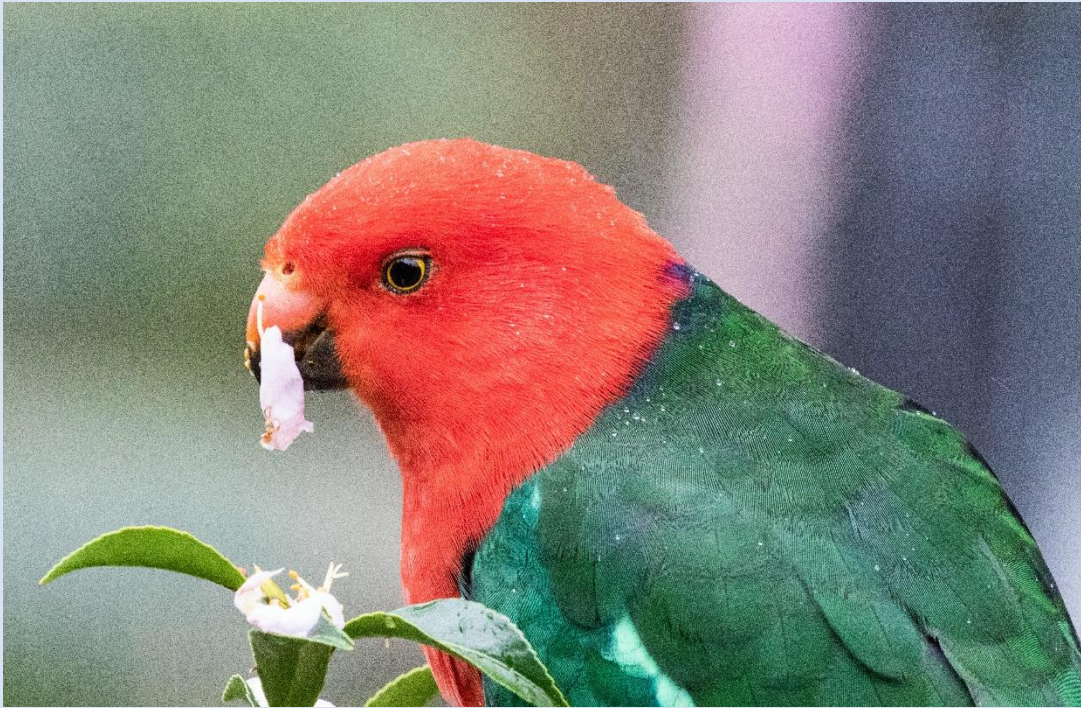


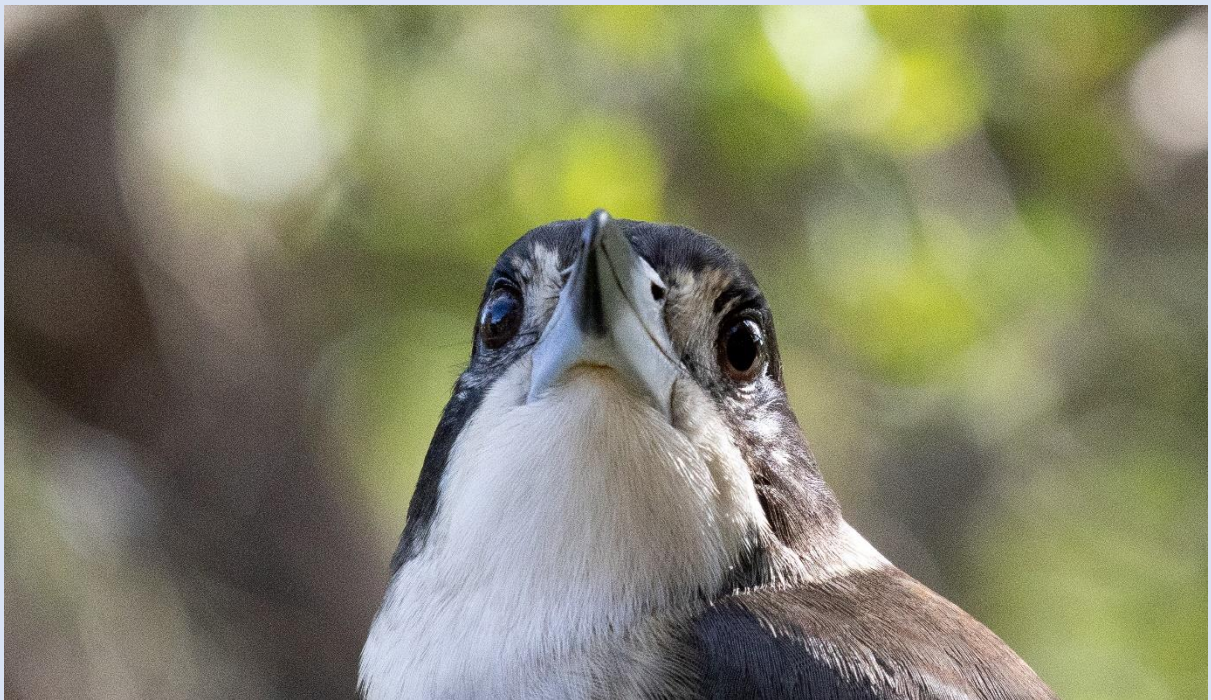




April

- Lots of images from our home. A home that will soon be no longer. Very mixed feelings







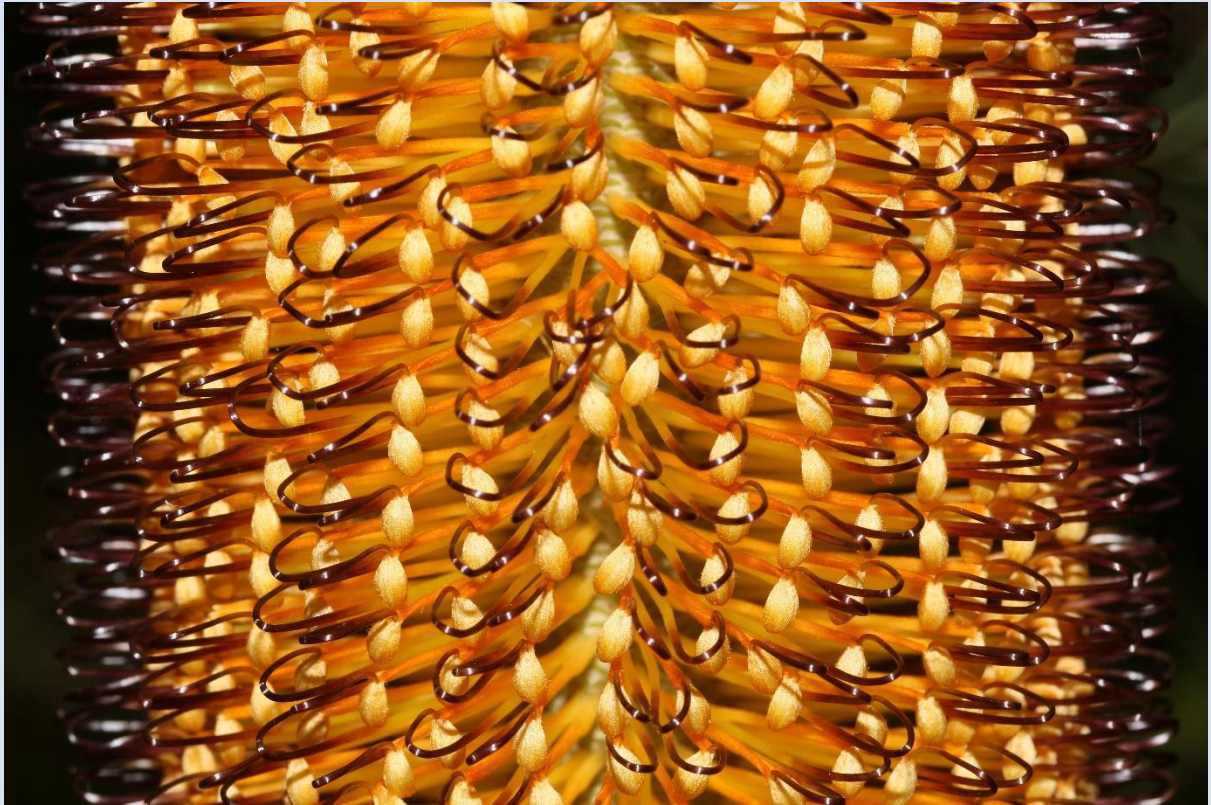




May

August

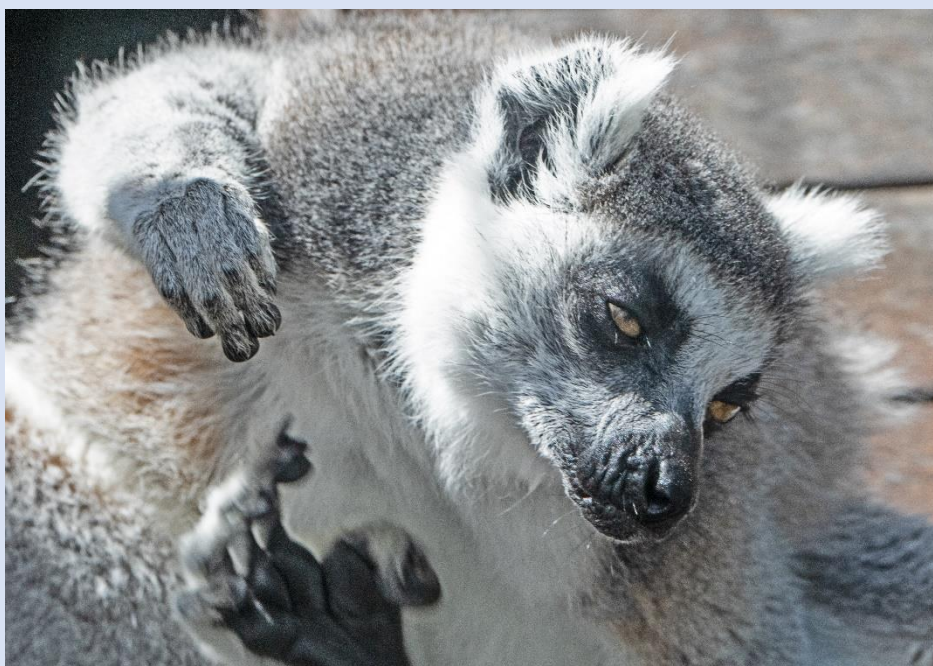
- Escape to Canberra; Mount Majura, Parliament House

- And many more walks and environmental meetings



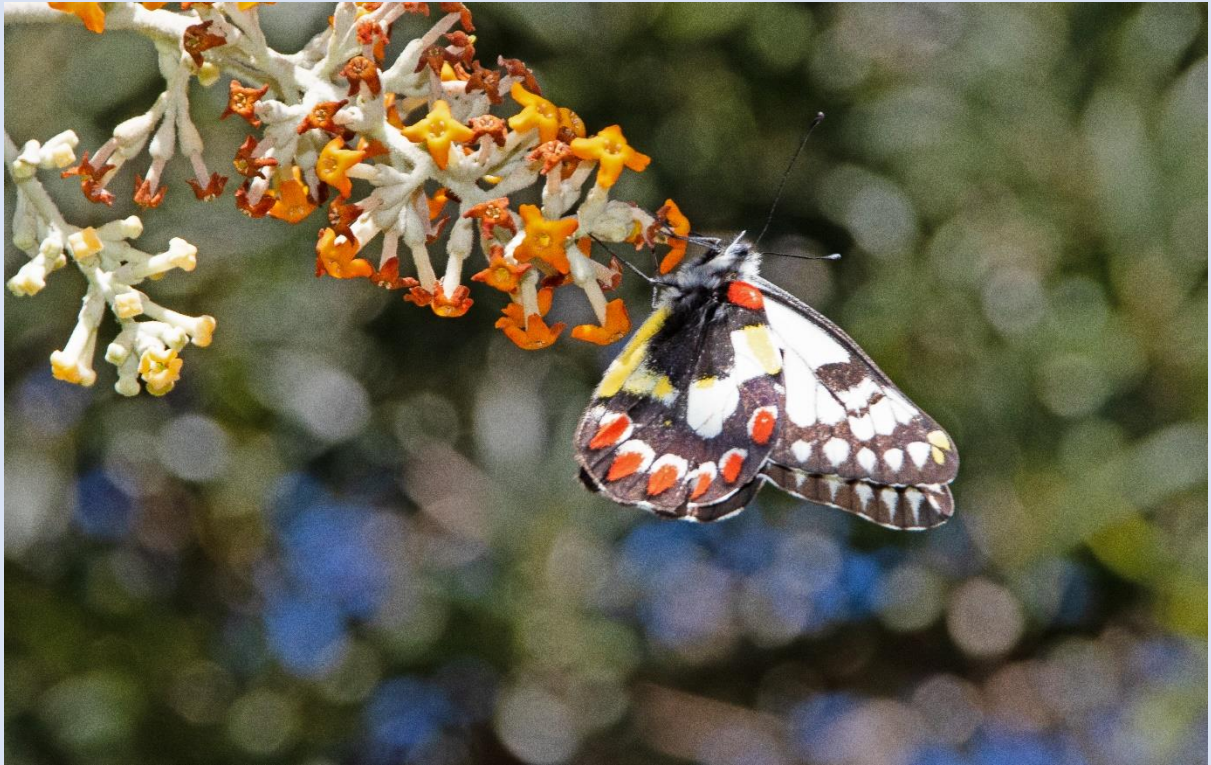


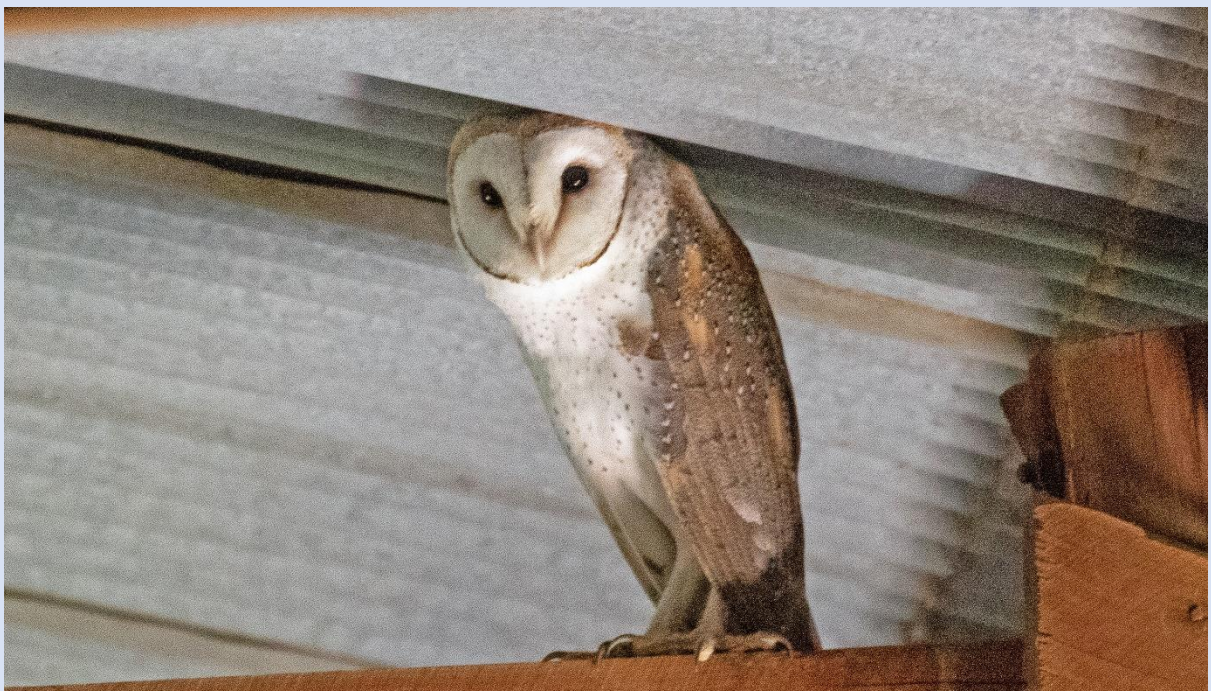












October

December

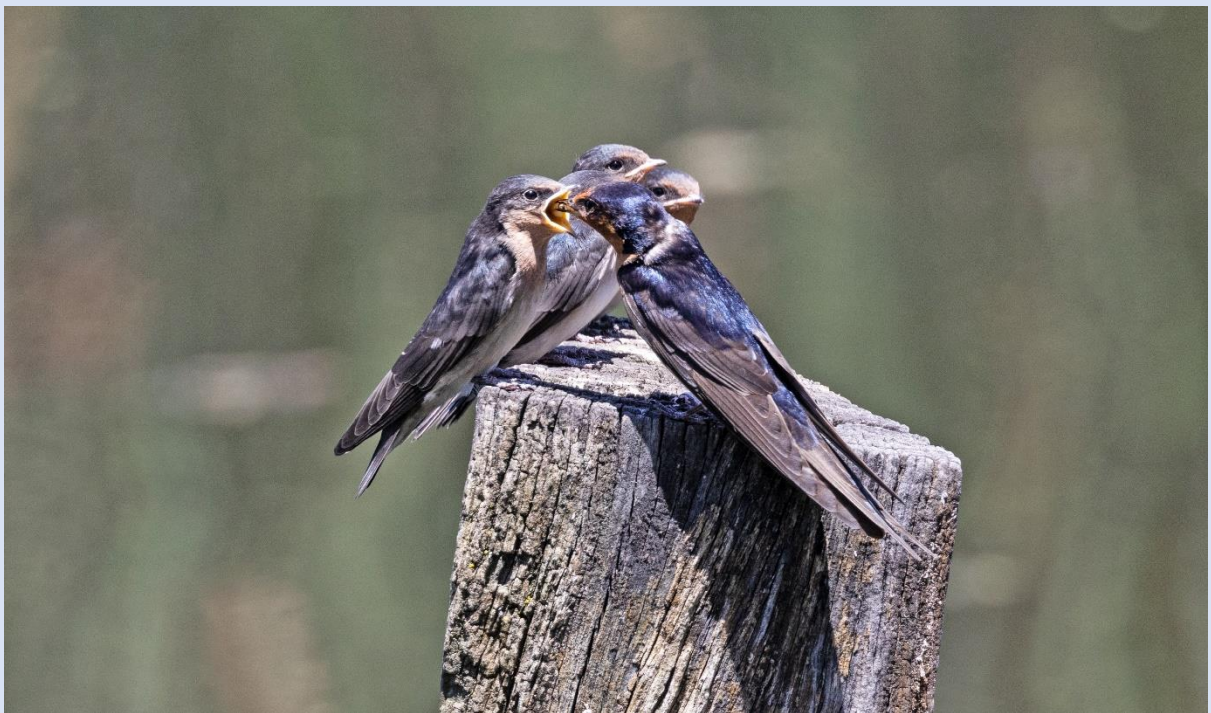
